Tacoma Celebrates the Grand Opening of Patsy Surh Place

Tacoma Housing Authority celebrated the grand opening of Patsy Surh Place which was designed and constructed to offer a culturally inclusive environment for Asian Pacific Islander elders and other low-income seniors earning up to 30% and 50% AMI. With 47 studio apartments and 30 one-bedroom units, the new six story building also features a community lounge, multipurpose room, gallery space, outdoor courtyard, and on-site laundry facilities. Through Tacoma Housing Authority's partnership with the Asia Pacific Cultural Center and the VA, 20 units will house homeless or at-risk Veterans through the VASH program.
