**Camp Catalyst Offers Youth a Summer of Inspiration and Unity** 

Combining MTW program funds with an <u>award from Bohemian Foundation</u>, Housing Catalyst (Fort Collins, CO) brought together community partners this summer to provide four weeks of free programing for residents entering grades 3-5 at all Housing Catalyst developments.

Camp Catalyst's social-emotional learning model focuses on collaborative teamwork, problem solving, and creative expression through specialized partner-driven activities including music fundamentals (Foundation Music School), STEM projects (The Quarter Project), and nature-based learning (Colorado Forest Service / Kids in Nature).

Housing Catalyst looks forward to building on the success of Camp Catalyst to reach more families in the years to come.

## Boca Raton Housing Authority Celebrates Community History with Groundbreaking of The Residences at Martin Manor

Born to a laundress and a sharecropper in Boca Raton, FL in September 1928, Lois Martin shared her love of mathematics with her students for nearly 40 years and devoted her personal energy to supporting community building and affordable housing in and around the Pearl City neighborhood.

This September, the Boca Raton Housing Authority (BRHA) honored Ms. Martin's legacy by breaking ground on an affordable housing redevelopment site named in her honor, The Residences at Martin Manor.

This redevelopment will replace the aging Dixie Manor homes originally built in 1942 as WWII Black Army barracks with 95 new units for families (36 one-bedroom, 39 two-bedroom, 18 three-bedroom, and 2 four-bedroom units), an outdoor playground and recreational space. Paying further honor to Ms. Martin's career as an educator, the community will also include the Lois Martin Community Center with after-school and summer programs operated by BRHA.

All units are affordable to households earning 22-80% AMI and residency will prioritize welcoming families returning from Dixie Manor. Construction is expected to be completed in the fall of 2026.
